JUDGE SISKIN ATTENDS TENNESSEE JUDICIAL ACADEMY

Murfreesboro, Tenn. – Judge M. Keith Siskin, of Murfreesboro, who serves the 16th Judicial District as a circuit court judge, attended the statewide Tennessee Judicial Academy last month in Murfreesboro.

More than 40 judges participated in the sessions, which included information on courtroom security, recent law updates, jury selection best practices, social media and campaign ethics. There also were breakout sessions for particular areas of the law, such as criminal, civil, juvenile and municipal.

Judge Siskin was appointed on October 29, 2012 by Gov. Bill Haslam. He holds a law degree from University of Georgia, where he served as editor-in-chief of the Georgia Journal of International and Comparative Law. He earned a B.A. from Vanderbilt University, from which he graduated cum laude. Prior to moving to the bench, Judge Siskin was a juvenile court magistrate for Rutherford County.

Judge Siskin serves with the Murfreesboro Noon Lions Club and is a past president of the Rutherford/Cannon County Bar Association. He is also a member of the Tennessee Bar Association and the American Bar Association.

“I am grateful for the opportunity to serve the citizens of Rutherford and Cannon counties,” said Judge Siskin.

The judges at the three-day session heard from experts in the field, including current Tennessee Supreme Court Justices, Appellate and Trial Judges, as well as law professors and field experts.
